

## The colors of the seasons

the 4 seasons of Vivaldi version jazz

The Four Seasons is one of the most popular works and performed in the panorama of classical music. However, the intensity of the melodies, harmonies and the modernity of the effectiveness of virtuoso passages mean that Vivaldi can not be relegated to one genre or historical period. His music is a great stimulus for composers, arrangers and musicians of our time.

Alessandro Cerino has received the message loud and emotional Vivaldi, respecting not only the logic and the construction of phrases and melodies, but also and especially the poetic verses that the author had accompanied the music. The result is an orchestral work in which jazz finds its own size symphony now fallen a bit 'into disuse and classical music regains the spirit of improvisation that from the mid-eighteenth century has been lost.

The Colors of the Seasons in both ways of reading are not only alternatives, but also simultaneously.

So the orchestra's interpretation entrusted to artists of both worlds, side by side and fused, sees the birth of a special atmosphere. Assist in this work is an opportunity to listen to the trends of jazz and Italian at the same time, compare them with classical music.

This is how four new seasons are not meant to replace the previous, but to integrate them becoming eight seasons in the colors of the seasons. Eleven scouts, after an odyssey of music, calling an unknown world of sound.
